### **Pogojni odvisniki/conditional sentences**

Glede na to, da smo že pričeli s pogojnimi odvisniki, bi si učenci snov dokončno prepisali v zvezke, ogledali kratko predstavitev in rešili nekaj primerov:

#### 1. GRAMMAR - Conditional sentences (if sentences)

### **CONDITIONAL SENTENCES („if “sentences)**

There are 4 main types of **if** sentences in English, often called **conditional** sentences. These sentences are in two halves (clauses):

**if clause**  
**odvisni stavek**

**main clause**  
**glavni stavek**

**ZERO CONDITIONAL** is a structure used for talking about *general truths*.

**if clause**

**main clause**

**If + Present Simple**

**Present Simple**

*Example:*

*If you heat the water to 100 degrees, it boils.*

*Water boils if you heat the water to 100 degrees.*

**FIRST CONDITIONAL** is a structure used for talking about *possibilities* in the present or in the future. The condition is real.

**if clause**

**main clause**

**If + Present Simple**

**Will Future,  
can, may**

*Example:*

*If you study hard, you will pass the test.*

*You will pass the test if you study hard.*

**SECOND CONDITIONAL** is a structure used for talking about *unreal situations* in the present. The condition is *unreal*.

**if clause**

**main clause**

**If + Past Simple**

**would, could, might**

*Example:*

*If I had a million dollars, I would buy a big house.*

*I would buy a big house if I had a million dollars.*

**NOTE:**

If the "if" clause comes first, **a comma is usually used**. If the "if" clause comes second, there is no need for a comma.

*Water boils if you heat it to 100 degrees.*

*You will pass the test if you study hard.*

*I would buy a big house if I had a million dollars.*

*I would have passed the exam if I had studied harder.*
